

## Student Application Process

## Exchange Student

# Exchange students are nominated by their home university to study at MUIC under a reciprocal exchange agreement established through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). They enroll for a specified period, gaining international academic and cultural experience while maintaining their student status at their home institution. Credit transfer is subject to their university's approval.

## Visiting Student

Non-reciprocal students can study at MUIC as visiting students for one trimester or up to a year. They remain enrolled at their home university while gaining international academic and cultural experience. Credit transfer is subject to their home university's approval.

## **Exchange Students**

#### Requirements:

- A copy of passport (valid for at least 6 months after study abroad completion at MUIC)
- An official transcript (with the university seal and verified as true copies by the home university)
- Certificate of English Proficiency (for students who are not native English speakers)\*
  - TOEFL iBT with a minimum score of 69 (Writing score 22)
  - IELTS (Academic) overall 6 (Writing 6)
  - o PTE (Academic) overall 50
  - Other qualification showing equivalent English Language proficiency accepted from previous students
- A nomination letter from the home university
- Proof of international health insurance\*\* (in English only and must have a branch office in Thailand)
- Student ID photo in JPEG format with size 1200 x 1400 pixels. (Sample photo) (The photo background must be either in plain blue or white and a shirt must be plain white with a collar and without suit, tie, blouse, etc.)

## Visiting Students

## Requirements:

- A copy of passport (valid for at least 6 months after study abroad completion at MUIC)
- An official transcript (with the university seal and verified as true copies by the home university)
- Certificate of English Proficiency (for students who are not native English speakers)\*
  - TOEFL iBT with a minimum score of 69 (Writing score 22)
  - IELTS (Academic) overall 6 (Writing 6)
  - o PTE (Academic) overall 50
  - Other qualifications showing equivalent English Language proficiency that have previously been accepted
- A proof of student's enrollment issued by the home university
- A reference letter issued by the home university
- Proof of international health insurance\*\* (in English only and must have a branch office in Thailand)
- 55 USD Visiting Application Fee (non-refundable)
- Student ID photo in JPEG format with size 1200 x 1400 pixels. (Sample photo) (The photo background must be either in plain blue or white and a shirt must be plain white with a collar and without suit, tie, blouse, etc.)

## Required Documents

## Certificate of English Proficiency

\* This requirement is waived for exchange and visiting students who are from native-English-speaking countries. Exchange and visiting students from English-medium institutions may provide a certifying letter from their home university, stating that they have met the minimum requirement of an IELTS (Academic) overall score of 6.0 (with a writing score of 6.0) or an equivalent qualification, as proof of their English proficiency.

## Proof of International Health Insurance Policy

**Proof of International Health Insurance (in English only)** must cover inpatient (IPD), outpatient (OPD), and accident treatment at private hospitals and be issued by a widely recognized insurer in Thailand. A direct billing contracts allows hospitals to bill insurers directly if your provider has an office in Thailand, enabling you to receive treatment without advance payment. Otherwise, you may need to pay upfront and claim reimbursement later.



#### Academic overview:

MUIC academic calendar operates on a trimester system. Each trimester has 12 weeks of lecture classes and one week of final exams. Lecture classes are scheduled every day between 8:00 - 18:00 hrs. Classes usually take place for two hours/day twice per week. Each course is worth 4 MUIC credits with equaling 48 hours of lectures.

#### Course load:


Inbound students are required to enroll in a minimum of 12 credits, which is typically equivalent to three lecture courses. The standard course load for exchange students is 16 credit hours per trimester, while visiting students can take up to 20 credits.

#### Special Note:

At MUIC, exchange and visiting students cannot enroll in research project classes and internships. Additionally, not all courses listed in the course catalog are offered every term, and exchange students may need approval from program directors to register for classes that require prerequisite courses.

#### **Examination Policy**

MUIC does not offer early or alternative examinations, nor is there a policy for retaking exams.



# Visa Information & Uniforms

## Visa Information

All students must obtain a Non-ED (student) visa before entering Thailand. MUIC will send a supporting letter directly to the student's email for use in the visa application at the Royal Thai Embassy in their home country. Working part-time or engaging in employment under a Non-ED visa is strictly prohibited by Thai immigration law.

## **Uniforms**

Students must wear the regular uniform while attending classes at MUIC and anywhere else on campus. Uniforms can be purchased at the college or students may bring white button-front shirts and black skirts for females or white button-front shirts and black trousers for males. Students must also wear plain black shoes or plain sport shoes.





## MUIC Buildings

Mahidol University International College (MUIC) is located in Mahidol University's Salaya Campus in Nakhon Pathom province, in the western outskirts of Bangkok. 




## Private accommodations near campus
